CENTER TOUR TAKES IFMA TO THE TOP!

If you didn't have a fear of heights, the view from the top at the Armada Hoffler building on our recent tour gave a great perspective on things to come for Virginia Beach's new Town Center!

Our hosts, Lou Haddad CEO Armada Hoffler and Rob Stanton, Senior Property Manger, Divaris gave us an insider's look at what is yet to come. The presentation included discussions of how it all came to be with the cities joint venture, impacts on taxes, infrastructure, and funding that all came together to make what was once thought only a dream to a reality. Imagine being responsible for the whole city block, buildings, construction sites, parking, tenants, and building maintenance and you'll have an idea of what Rob handles on a daily basis.

He and his staff respond to roughly 350 calls per month with an occupancy of 93% in the office spaces alone! Divaris currently manages 700,000 feet of office and retail space in 5 separate blocks and 1,859 parking spaces. Their contract security and housekeeping operate around the clock. In November they will start opening Block 10 which will include 341 apartments, 850 parking spaces and 50,000 square feet of retail space. Groundbreaking for the Arts center and Westin hotel were only days away at the time of our tour. The restaurants are running at full bore and claim approximately 36 million in sales! If you missed the tour, don't miss the great food and ever changing sites as the developments unfold.

Bob is currently responsible for over 600,000 square feet of owned and leased space, with another 140,000 square feet to come at the Princess Anne Health Campus (PAHC). He also manages 120 leases and is project manager of the 32 acre PAHC currently underway. Somewhere in that mix he is also responsible for 5 direct reports. Bob's motto is the Nike motto, "Just Do It!" He's proud of his success with "fast track" projects and was able to deliver a recent development for the School of Health at Sentara in record time.
