NORFOLK INTERNATIONAL TERMINALS TOUR

On Tuesday, Nov. 16, the IFMA membership gathered at Norfolk International Terminals for a most unique and informative tour. The Virginia International Terminals, Inc., was established in 1982 to unify the Ports of Hampton Roads to include Newport News Terminal, Portsmouth Marine Terminal and the Virginia Inland Port in Front Royal, Virginia.

The tour was conducted by Rene Rose and other members of the VIT Team in the VIT Tower – some 100 feet above the entire operation – overseeing all aspects of the port operation.

Of particular interest was the flow of goods into and out of the port by truck and rail. Norfolk Southern recently overhauled all of their tunnels and underpasses to allow a double-stack of containers on each rail car. This improvement will allow goods arriving at VIT terminals to be shipped as far away as the Midwest on NS rails. For example, all goods purchased at Target stores east of the Mississippi River arrive at VIT ports.

Virginia International Terminals ships approximately 1.89 million containers of cargo each year which means it is the 3rd largest port on the east coast next to New York and Savannah, GA. Revenues are 41 billion per year in goods and services and so are an integral part, not only of the Hampton roads area, but for all of the State.
