A Trip Through Your Facility

October IFMA-HR Chapter Meeting

On October 15, 2019, the IFMA Chapter gathered at the Chesapeake Conference Center to listen to a presentation by Mr. Roger Shull, C.E.M., Director of Energy Business Development at Damuth Trane Virginia.

Mr. Shull provided the group with insight into the ways a typical facility consumes energy and the ways that this consumption can be regulated. In addition, Mr. Shull focused on the challenges of the energy industry itself as it works to address the increasing demands of consumers while both transitioning away from fossil fuels and dealing with a regulatory environment that makes increasing supplies a cost prohibitive endeavor. Facility Managers



were asked to focus on the small ways and the large ways that they can work to make their facilities more energy efficient while partnering with the local energy provider to take advantage of incentives for load management and throttling of demand.

Seton House - 2018

IFMA-HR Service Project

Recently, the International Facility Management Association of Hampton Roads (IFMA-HR) partnered with the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE) to provide an HVAC upgrade to Seton House Youth Shelters, located in Virginia Beach.

Serving all of Hampton Roads, Seton House Youth Shelters provide 24-hour emergency shelters for youth ages 9-17 years old. This program serves runaway/homeless youth and youth in crisis within their family, school and/or community.
